Kids Klub!

Kids Klub is our afterschool program that we moved from Wednesday evenings to Wednesday afternoons last January. We believe this format is a more fruitful approach to ministry in our community as we focus more on helping children succeed in their academics. In an effort to have a bigger impact,



beginning September 28 and 30 we will run **Kids Klub** on both Monday and Wednesday afternoons from 3:30 pm to 5:30 pm and volunteers are needed. Please pick EITHER Monday or Wednesday

from 3:15 pm to 5:30 pm to help. Your job will be to help one or two children (no more) with their homework for one hour, then guide kids through the rest of the program which includes: games, snacks, life skills, and Bible stories. Training for volunteers will be Monday, September 21, from 3:30 pm to 5:30 pm for Monday volunteers; and Wednesday, September 23, for Wednesday volunteers.

I Am Who He Says I Am

"I Am Who He Says I Am" was the title of *Walk in the Light Ministries* 45th Awards Banquet held on July 10, 2015. Several people were honored at the event including: Chief Archbishop Emeritus **Louella H. Tate**, 2015 Hartford Mayoral Candidate and former Probate Judge **Bob Killian**, Congressman **John Larson (D)**, **Dr. Marcus M. McKinney** of St. Francis Hospital, as well as **Pastor Adam Söderberg** and Director of Children and Family Ministry **Vicki Huffman**.

It was a blessed celebration. Seven-year old **Deshawn Chapman** recited Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s "I Have a Dream" speech from memory. **Pastor Lawrence Chester** formerly of Guyana, South America, delivered the keynote address and Pastor Adam was asked to speak as well.

Congratulations **Miss Vicki** and **Pastor Adam**. It is a blessing to see South Church being recognized as a vital and active participant in the city of Hartford.

An Incredible Story

As I continue working on my updated history of the Second Church of Christ in Hartford (otherwise known as South Congregational Church) I am constantly reminded of what an amazing God we serve and what an amazing church He founded here in 1670. One reason is our focus on missions and outreach - a hallmark of our ministry for years.

Under the Reverend Irving Berg's leadership, by 1916, more than 13% percent of all funds given to South Church was being used for foreign, home, and city missions; church planting, education, the YMCA, refugee relief, Tuskegee Institute, Piedmont College, campships and parish benevolences.

In 1948, we helped with the founding of Lady Doak College in South India and raised the needed funds to purchase additional property for the school and build a new clinic.

South Church also supported Dr. Mary Cushman (1870-1965) and her mission to establish a hospital in Chilesso, Angola, West Africa.

Dr. Henry David Gray focused a lot of energy on missions and outreach. "[We need] an adventure in service to the spiritual needs of the inner city." His ideas included, "sponsoring as a church or cooperatively with others: a day nursery, teenage center, or club for older people." He also suggested business-

men's luncheons or breakfasts in the Main Street church to serve those whose "daily battles of life" often seem "forgotten" by churches. South Church was also an enthusiastic supporter of the Waldensian Aid Society who today advocates and helps support the persecuted church.

During Dr. Gray's pastorate missions and outreach spending increased 90% going from over \$11,000 in 1955 to more than \$110,000 in the late 1960's. In fact, total South Church missions and outreach monies from 1956-1969 exceeded \$5,000,000.

In the 1970's, during Dr. Elmore's pastorate, South Church partnered with Pastor Philotheos Zikas and supported his church (our sister church) in Greece - the Evangelical Church of Alexandroupolis.

Today, whether it is reaching out to Hartford through Covenant to Care or the Sparrow Ministry or supporting our sister church and school in Camp Perrin, Haiti, it is such a blessing to continue serving others just as all our brothers and sisters who came before us did.
