

## Pastor's Corner

It has happened again. Seventeen people gunned down. Seventeen families facing an unimaginable horror. Emotions are running high. People are desperate to do something. Anything. Calls to address mental health issues, hire security guards, and ban weapons come from everywhere. Most are sincere. You can hear deep anguish in their voices. Family, friends, teachers, first responders, and yes, politicians. Sadly, tragedies like this are the one time we will hear politicians from both parties say (out loud!), "Our thoughts and prayers are with the families." Once again, we endure the utter hypocrisy of politicians asking us to pray. Many of them revile the mention of God, Jesus, or the Christian faith at any other time, but it is fashionable now, so feel free. Our overlords have decreed it acceptable, however temporary the sentiment may be.

We tend to have short memories. The cry to ban "assault weapons" rings out again, even though it proved ineffective. Have we forgotten the "Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994" which banned assault weapons was in place for ten years? As it was due to expire in 2004, an in depth study was done by the "Task Force on Community Preventive Services." This independent, non-federal task force examined an assortment of firearm laws, including the assault weapons ban, and found "insufficient evidence to determine the effectiveness of any of the firearms laws reviewed for preventing violence." Another review of firearms research by the National Research Council committee agreed, stating that the assault weapons ban "did not reveal any clear impacts on gun violence outcomes." As such, the Department of Health and Human Services Centers for Disease Control and Prevention issued a report, which concluded that the ten-year assault weapons ban had no discernable impact on gun violence in the United States. Now, I suppose, we can pretend all of that never happened, and ban them again, but, sadly, it would not work -- again. It may make us all feel better, though. We will have "done" something. Anything.

Since its founding, firearms have always been present in our country. That has never changed, but when I was in high school, there were no school shootings. I never saw anyone bring a firearm to school. I never heard anyone talk about

bombing or shooting up the school, although firearms were just as available in the late 1970's. In fact, one could argue with all of the restrictions put in place since, that firearms are less available today. Access to firearms has not changed in the past forty years. The percentage of Americans who own guns has not changed. We have. What is the cause? I offer this. Does anyone else see the correlation between the slow, steady, and persistent decline in church attendance, and the slow, steady and persistent increase in gun violence? As a nation, we have done our level best to exclude God from every part of our society, and when a space is created something (or someone) will fill it. As we have kicked God out of

the public square, why are we surprised that Satan has gladly filled the vacuum? Have you ever seen the bumper sticker "No God, No Peace ~ Know God, Know Peace?" God has not been allowed in our public schools for decades now. Did we really think there would be no consequences? When light leaves, darkness takes its place. No God. No Peace.

If we just want to feel like we are doing something, we can ban all the weapons we want. The truth is an AR-15 is no more deadly than any other rifle. It just looks scary. That is why young men gravitate toward it, but if they cannot get their hands on an AR-15, they will simply use a different rifle or handgun or whatever is the second scariest looking gun out there. Laws cannot defeat evil. Only God can, and as a society, we have decided He is not an option. He is politically incorrect. Mention of Him might offend someone. Therefore, we voluntarily reject the most powerful weapon the universe has ever known (God) because we believe we have a better solution. It is ironic. We thought that same thing in the Garden of Eden, before the flood, as we were building the Tower of Babel, etc. It is so unfortunate, but I have seen this movie before, and, sadly, I know how it ends.

- The Pilgrims left Plymouth Harbor in England on September 6, 1620. They sought the freedom to worship their way in the colonies. The voyage is difficult, but only one of the 102 passengers dies. They spend 66 days and nights with 102 people all in a room the size of a volleyball court.





## Looking Ahead: Children and Family Ministries


**MARK YOUR CALENDARS** for these upcoming events!

## How Do We Properly Worship God?

How do we properly worship God? This is a question that many have pondered at one point or another, sometimes unknowingly. Many people are quick to answer with the style in which they worship. Maybe they sing contemporary songs with hands raised or perhaps they prefer to sing through hymns found in a hymnal accompanied by the sound of the pipe organ. Some might say that they connect with the Lord through silent contemplative prayer while still others prefer the lifting of praises aloud and speaking in tongues. Some worship God through personal dedication and study while others prefer to devote free time to volunteer opportunities. While differences in preference might divide us in our opinions on how to properly worship God there is one thing that unifies them all: Worship is an act of giving and not receiving.

The Word of God states in Romans 14:6 “Those who worship the Lord on a special day do it to honor Him.” Notice that the scripture does not say we worship the Lord in order to receive answer to prayer. It also doesn’t say that we attend worship to hear our favorite songs, or a message that always applies to our own lives and experience. Our focus on Sundays, as well as every day, should be on worshipping God through giving. This includes giving of our songs, prayers, tithes, gifts/talents, time and even our faults and failures. As I often pray on Sunday mornings, we need to leave our worries at the door so that we might fully focus on giving God our praise and thanks. We can also give God our worries as well, but we must trust that he will handle them.

Scripture goes on to state in Verses 7-8, “For we don’t live for ourselves or die for ourselves. If we live, it’s to honor the Lord. And if we die, it’s to honor the Lord.” This is a reminder that giving of ourselves in worship shouldn’t end

when the benediction is finished on Sunday morning. We should be living lives that continually worship and glorify God, even outside the walls of the church. In fact, Matthew 28:19 tells us, “Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.” What better way to be light and salt in the world than to worship God through all that we do!

This brings me to the calling I believe God has put on my heart for this year. In talking with **Pastor Adam**, it is a calling that has been laid on his heart as well. As a church we need to not only offer our worship to God daily, but we must also strive to present our best worship. God deserves so much more than our leftovers or our second best attempts. If we look at giving from a monetary sense, we are asked to give our first ten percent as a tithe and offering to the Lord. Can we apply that same rule to other aspects of our lives and worship? Do we give God ten percent of our day? That’s a little less than two and a half hours a day. Are we giving the best of what we have or do we give God what we have left in the tank after a long week?

We will be having some opportunities coming up over the next few months for you to get involved here at South. You will be able to give your gifts and your time through many different volunteer opportunities we are trying to get started. Help us to serve our congregation and community while also serving God as well. My goal for this year is to help inspire a giving heart for our community both within and outside our walls. What an incredible testimony that can be for Hartford and for the state of Connecticut.

### What's New?


